Please note: 'person' possesses a body, mind and ability to act for his or her interest (effort); 'property' includes any possession to which he or she assigns value that could have been the result of personal acts of creation or through paid effort compensated by someone else.

Where did this Statement of Purpose come from?

The above statement was derived as a consolidation of two well-known Libertarian and Classical Liberal ideas:

The non-aggression principle (or NAP, also called the non-aggression axiom, the anti-coercion, zero aggression principle or non-initiation of force) is an ethical stance that asserts that aggression is inherently wrong. In this context, "aggression" is defined as initiating or threatening any forcible interference with an individual or individual's property. https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Non-aggression-principle

Individual Property Rights (IPR) is another closely related dimension of Libertarianism. Property rights are theoretical, socially enforced constructs in economics for determining how a resource or economic good is used and owned.

Why is this Purpose so important?

Notice what Libertarians do we "defend and protect"!

Against what and whom? The intentional and unwanted actions of others that threaten or actually harm innocent victims.

The greatest single aggressor in Ontario's history is the Government of Ontario. Since it began on July 1, 1867, it has created and currently enforces an ever-expanding book of regulations that contains 380,000+rules to which we are all subject.

To use a team sports analogue, BORG politicians play "Offense" because they try to "score" power one regulation at a time by selling to a gullible public promises of more government intervention and more spending. In reality, this strategy is based on "buying" votes with our money. Libertarians play "Defense" by trying to stop the BORG from gaining power and from expanding Ontario's base of regulations AND the enormous costs to finance their enforcement.

What is bad about regulations?

Not all regulations are bad.

Those that exist to protect and defend individual 'person' and 'property' rights are **good**. So are those that protect unwanted abuses to our environment that could harm our citizens.

The **bad** regulations are the ones that are created to assign unique privileges to Special Interest Groups at

the expense of everyone else. My favourite example has always been labour legislation such as the Rand Formula that has allowed public sector labour union executives to aggress against, and harm, many innocent victims. College students, who lost paid class time during he 2017 college strike, suffered real harm. Union members, who were forbidden against their will to cross the picket line during the same strike, were also innocent victims. Parents, who have had to make other arrangements for their public school children, have also paid a price for unwanted union aggression by past strikes by the Elementary Teachers Federation of Ontario.

The number and political influence of Special Interest Groups has grown rapidly in the past decade thanks to social media and the Internet. This fact has fueled social divisions and animosity across many fault lines in society, including numerous forms of "identity politics". Great thinkers like Dr. Jordan Peterson are fighting this battle, but he faces strong head wings from the BORG parties and all forms of media journalists who seek to fuel and exploit it for their own gains.

If only the good regulations existed and were adequately enforced, none of the Special Interest Groups would be legislatively empowered to get away with the divisive politics of today. If the 80/20 Rule applies to our existing book of regulations, this would mean that 80% of 380,000 regulations – 304,000 regulations – could be safely cut to eliminate the power and privilege imbalances that exist.

As the future "Regulation Cleanup Crew for Queen's Park", we have a lot of work to do, my fellow Libertarians!

Our battleground IS regulations!

Journalist Rex Murphy recently quoted Conservative MP Maxime Bernier as saying: "I wish to live in a society where everyone is treated equally and not defined by their race".

To Mad Max, I say: "Join the Libertarians and work with us to systematically eliminate every regulation that stops your wish from coming true!"

FINANCIAL SUMMARY—2017

The table on the right summarizes our Income and Expenses for the calendar year 2017 compared to the previous year. Selected "project" type of expenses are highlighted.

In 2016 Allen Small ran a very active campaign during the Scarborough-Rouge River By-election. During his campaign the Party actively solicited donations. In the Sault Ste Marie By-election in 2017 Gene Balfour (who lives in Fenelon Falls) was our "Name on the Ballot." We paid someone in the riding to collect signatures to get his name on the ballot.

The registration Fee for the 2016 AGM was \$50 and was treated as a donation, eligible for the 75% Political Tax Credit. In 2017 the Elections Finances Act was revised and a tax credit was not allowed for the Convention fees so we reduced the fee to \$25. This may have contributed to the increased attendance, and the doubling of the cost.

As a result of increasing membership and appeals for donations to our "War Chest" we are in good condition to support our Full Slate project. Our Bank Balance on December 31, 2017 was \$38,926.
